
Plural Possessive Nouns

To show possession for plural nouns, the apostrophe goes after the s

For example: The ducks' pond.



For example: The children's teacher.

Plural Possessive Nouns Answers

For irregular plurals, the apostrophe goes before the s.

For example: The children's teacher.
