| Alliteration | Words beginning with the same sound placed close together to emphasise a point. | |
| Hyperbole | Language that exaggerates. It is not intended to be taken literally. | |
| Metaphor | A comparison between two different things, often using 'is' or 'was'. | |
| Onomatopoeia | Words that imitate sounds. | |
| Personification | Human characteristics given to things that are not human. | |
| Pun | A play on words intended to be humorous. | |
| Rhyme | The repetition of similar sounds in the end of words. | |
| Rhythm | The beat and pace of a poem. | |
| Simile | A comparison between two different things, normally using 'like' or 'as'. | |
