

Homographs

Homographs are pairs of words that have the same spelling.

Sometimes the words have the same or a similar pronunciation.

For example: 'right' (*to be correct*) and 'right' (*left and right*).

Some homographs have a different pronunciation.

For example, 'tear' (*a drop of liquid from the eye*) and 'tear' (*to pull something apart*).

One of the homograph pairs has been used in a sentence.

Example: 'right'
