

## Speech Marks “ ”

**Speech marks** or **quotation marks** are used to show direct speech (what someone is saying).

Direct speech can go at the **beginning of the sentence**:

“I like pizza,” said May.

Direct speech can go at the **end of the sentence**:

May said, “I like pizza.”
