Homographs are pairs of words that have the **same spelling**.

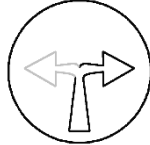
The pronunciation of these words can be:

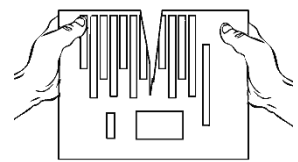

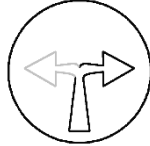

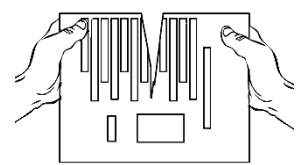
