

Speech Marks “ ”



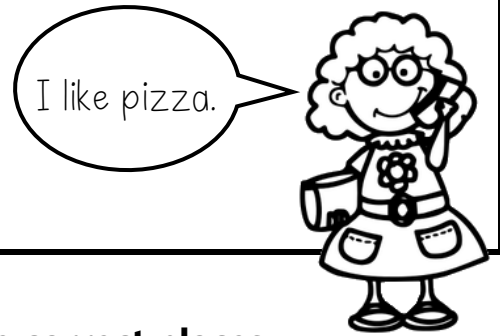
Speech marks or **quotation marks** are used to show direct speech (what someone is saying).

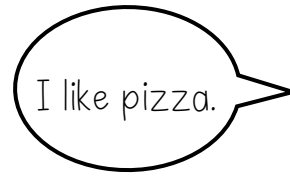
