Alliteration	Words beginning with the same sound placed close together to emphasise a point.	The airport was filled with tired travellers.
Hyperbole	Language that exaggerates. It is not intended to be taken literally.	I can run so fast not even the wind can catch me!
Metaphor	A comparison between two different things, often using 'is' or 'was'.	The fire was a beast.
Onomatopoeia	Words that imitate sounds.	Snap! The mysterious box slammed shut.
Personification	Human characteristics given to things that are not human.	The angry wind lashed the coastline.
Pun	A play on words intended to be humorous.	A saladlettuce celebrate!
Rhyme	The repetition of similar sounds in the end of words.	Kate jumped up in the air, A spider in her hair!
Rhythm	The beat and pace of a poem.	SNA-ils CLIM-bing WIN-dows SNA-ils CLIM-bing STAIRS.
Simile	A comparison between two different things, normally using 'like' or 'as'.	The words were like a dagger in his side.
