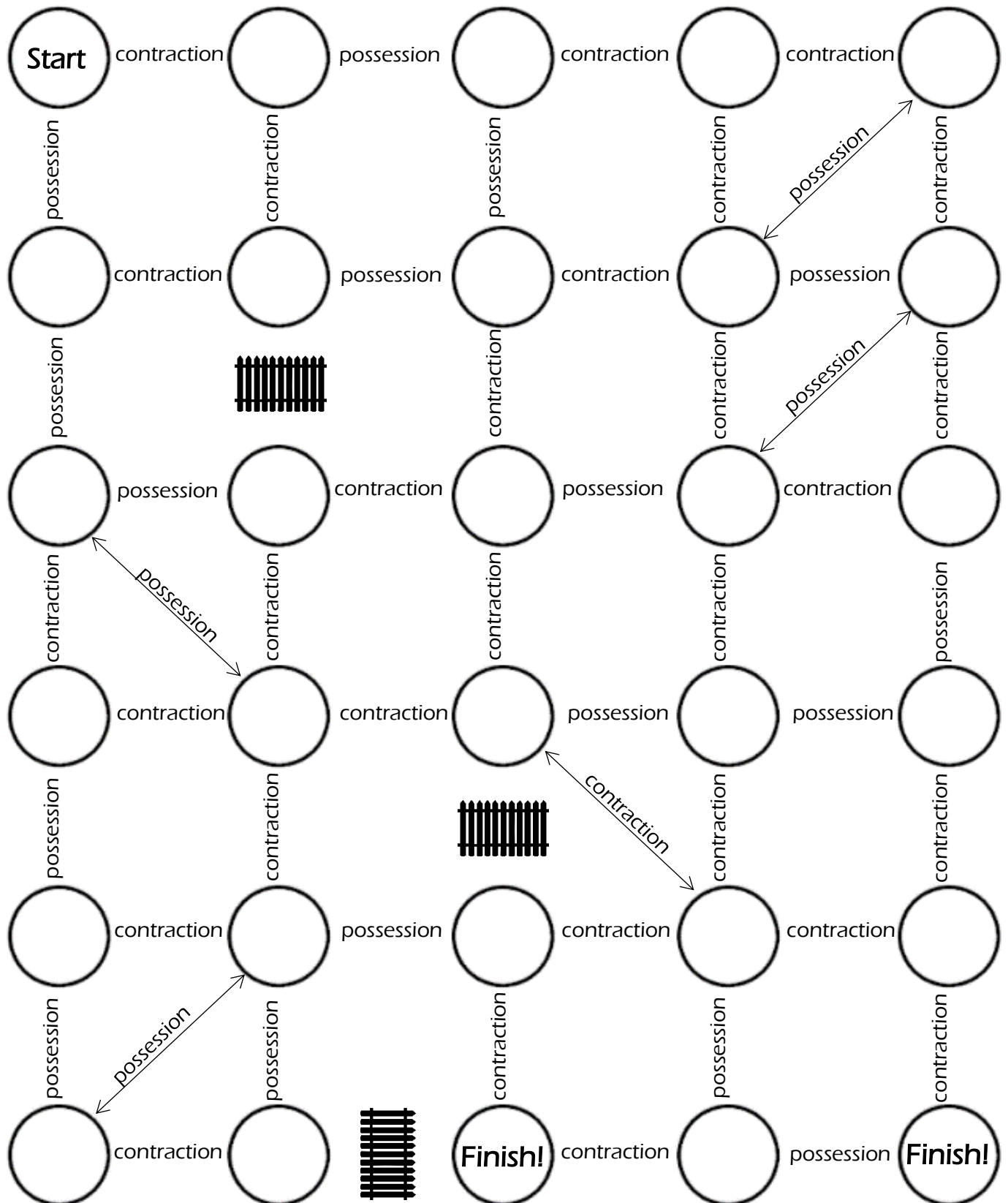


Apostrophes Everywhere!

How to Play: Each player places their counter on 'Start'. The first player takes a card from the pile (face down) and works out whether the apostrophe is for a contraction or for a possessive noun. The player must then move to a new circle along a path that matches the apostrophe type ('possession' or 'contraction'). Some fences block the path!

The first player to reach one of the 'Finish!' circles is the winner.
