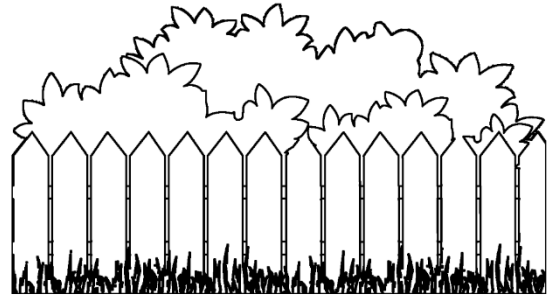


Prepositional Phrases

around her neck

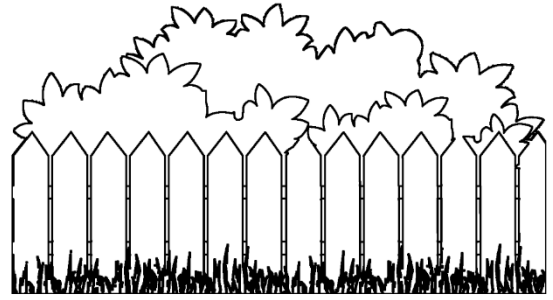
