KATE: How frustrating is it seeing people put their own lives, and the lives of the lifeguards, at risk by not following advice that's given?


JONAS: It's very frustrating. We really love seeing people out on the beach having fun, but fun can turn to danger in the blink of an eye if people aren't careful.

JONAS: The most important thing is to always, *always* swim between the red and yellow flags. If you're swimming between the flags, you can be guaranteed there are lifeguards on duty, and it also means it's a safer area to swim.

KATE: That's definitely an important thing to remember. Is there anything else visitors to the beach should remember?

JONAS: Know your ability If you're not a strong swimmer, never go out further than you can touch. Also remember stay safe in the sun. It's going to be a hot couple of months!

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
