Bushfires

Water is an essential resource in extinguishing fires as it helps cool down burning materials and prevents further spreading. Firefighters on the ground wear special protective gear and utilise high-pressure hoses to spray water directly onto flames or smouldering embers. Aircraft equipped with large buckets or tanks filled with water are also used to help control the spread of bushfires.



Bushfires often spread rapidly, leaving little time for residents to evacuate or protect their properties. As a result, many homes are often destroyed, leaving families without shelter and precious belongings. Not only do bushfires destroy properties, but they also result in loss of life for both humans and animals. Additionally, the habitat destruction caused by bushfires continues to impact wildlife for years after a fire is extinguished. The population of species reliant on these habitats may experience declines, as they struggle to find food and shelter.



Creating and regularly reviewing an emergency plan detailing what to do in case of a fire is essential. Additionally, it is crucial for people in high-risk areas to have a fully stocked first aid kit on hand. Furthermore, property maintenance is very important. Regularly clearing dry leaves and debris from gutters, trimming overgrown vegetation, and keeping lawns mowed short decreases potential fuel sources.
